

## D J CHAMPIONSHIP LEAGUE (rules amended May 28<sup>th</sup> 2013)

1. There will be two sections called D and J. The winner of each Section will play to determine the overall winner.
2. Each team to consist of two rinks and matches will be played on a home and away basis over a period of two years. A draw will be made every two years to determine in which section teams play.  
Clubs may enter more than one team, but players will only be able to play for one of those teams. **It is not necessary to send names to the D J Co-ordinator.**  
Registration fee for each team is £20, which must be sent to the Hon Treasurer by 5th October.
3. **A player can only play for the D J team from the club to which she is affiliated.**
4. Home team will be responsible for arranging games with the other clubs in their section and these dates must be notified to the League Co-ordinator, before the start of the season. If, exceptionally, it is necessary to make any changes to these dates the League Co-ordinator should be notified of the new date. Failure to reach an agreement will result in the points being shared.
5. Team captain to collect all green fees for her team and pay them directly to the host club.
6. Games to be played over 21 ends or 4 hours whichever is sooner - this time to include trial ends.
7. Scoring: Total of 8 points  
2 points for a winning rink, 1 point each for a draw.  
4 points for overall win or 2 points for each if the match is drawn.  
In the case of two teams being equal on points at the end of the season, shot difference and then ends won, will decide the winning team.
8. **If a team defaults on a fixture all points (8) will be awarded to the opposition + 10 shots and 10 shots will be deducted from the defaulting team.**
9. If a Club is unable to field a full team, it is permissible for a triple/or triples to play with a deduction of 25% of the score for each triple.
10. **15 minutes will be allowed for late arrival.**
11. Team captain to collect and check score cards ensuring they are signed and both captains are responsible for ensuring that the results are notified to the League Co-ordinator, either by e-mail or telephone. **The cards to be retained at the Club until the end of the season.**
12. **League tables will be sent to Club Secretaries regularly throughout the season and these should be displayed on the club notice board.**
13. Dress: for all section games, grey skirts, cropped or tailored trousers, with white or club tops and white/brown shoes.  
For the final: white skirts or tailored trousers, with white or club tops and white/brown shoes.
14. When a game has to be stopped because of extenuating circumstances, the game will resume with the scores at the time of the stoppage.  
Date and venue to be arranged in accordance with rules.
15. **Other than as stated above - National rules apply. Any disputes must be referred to the National Secretary (and confirmed in writing) for discussion by the Executive Committee.**
